THE COACHES: Bart Tatum is in his fourth season as head coach at Missouri Southern after spending 12 seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State. In his three seasons at Southern, Tatum has led the Lions to a 18-24 record and two sixth place finishes in the MIAA.

Under Tatum, the Lions have produced one of the nation's best receivers in Colin Bado as Bado led Division II in receptions per game in 2006, racking up eight per contest. 2006 also saw the highest drafted Lion in program history as senior offensive tackle Allen Barbre went to the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round of the NFL Draft. In 2007, the Lions had the program's first winning record in ten years, finishing 6-5.

Last season, Jared Brawner led the MIAA in tackles and was an All-MIAA, All-Region and All-American selection. The Lions also led the MIAA in pass defense for the second-straight season.

While at Northwest, Tatum helped the Bearcats to seven MIAA titles, eight NCAA Division II postseason appearances, three NCAA-II national title game appearances and two national championships.

He coached the Northwest offensive line for 10 seasons and served as recruiting coordinator for five years. Tatum was promoted to assistant head coach prior to the 2002 season, and he added the titles of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach prior to the 2004 campaign.

Kevin Verdugo is in his fifth season at Fort Hays State. He has an overall record of 14-39 and is 6-20 in his career in MIAA games. He is 1-2 against the Lions.

He has previously served as an assistant coach at Division I schools Southern Illinois, Akron and Southeast Missouri, while serving one season as the head coach at Fort Scott (Kan.) CC. **Lions on the Air:** Each Missouri Southern football game can be heard on 1230 AM the Talker. Kevin Greim provides the playby-play with Jon Tupper alongside for color commentary and Aaron Cox roaming the sidelines.

THE SERIES: Missouri Southern holds the all-time series with an overall record of 12-9-1. The Lions have a 6-4 record at Hughes Stadium and are 6-5-1 at Lewis Field in Hays. The two teams renewed their series in 2006 for the first time since 1988, with the Tigers snapping a season-long losing streak with a 10-0 win over Southern. Last season, the Lions returned the favor with a 6-0 win at home. Prior to that, the last time for the two to meet was when both schools were a member of the NAIA Central States Intercollegiate Conference. Southern won that game 21-10. Southern has won eight of the last nine games against the Tigers, dating back to the 1983 season.

LIONS LAST TIME OUT: Nineteenth ranked Central Missouri scored 20 points in the fourth guarter and rebounded from an early 10-0 deficit to defeat the Lions 27-17 today in Warrensburg.

Last week, it was the Lions (3-6, 3-5 MIAA) scoring points in the fourth guarter to overcome a deficit, but the tables were turned today as the Mules (8-2, 6-2 MIAA) scored 20 points in the fourth to defeat the Lions and keep their playoff hopes alive.

Southern scored first as the Lions took

advantage of a fumble from the Mules' DeMarco Cosby that was recovered by Jabarri Wesley and returned 11 yards to the Central Missouri 45-yard line. Roland Thompson completed two passes for for 16 yards and ran for another 13, before Andrew Gassen booted a 29-yard field goal to put Southern up on top, 3-0.

Central turned the ball over on its first two possessions as on the first drive of the game, Nick Teer sacked guarterback Eric Czerniewski and forced a fumble that Domenique Butler recovered.

The Lions took a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter after Johnny Johnson capped off a 12-play drive that took up 61 yards and 3:38 off the clock when Johnson found the end zone on a four-yard run. Thompson completed passes of 24, 10 and 14 on the drive.

The Mules answered back quickly and after the Lions had a three and out, Central took just two plays to score when Czerniewski found Bobby Guillory for a 47-yard catch to cut the Lions' lead to 10-7 heading into halftime.

Neither team scored in the third, but Central scored just two minutes into the fourth on a one-yard run from Czerniewski. Guillory made the score 20-10 when he scampered to the end zone on a 33-yard touchdown. Each team added a late score for the final tally.

The Lions were out-gained 480-337 today, but were close in most every other category with the Mules. Central held a 20-19 advantage on first downs, and time of possession was nearly identical. Both teams had three turnovers with the Lions throwing three interceptions, but picking up three of the five Central Missouri fumbles. The big stat where Central had an advantage was on punt and kickoff returns. The Mules averaged 21.3 yards per punt return as opposed to the Lions 5.5 and 11.7 yards on kickoffs to the Lions' 4.4.

Thompson was the Lions leading rusher with 44 yards and a touchdown score. He averaged 6.3 yards per carry. He also went 21-47 for 239 yards. Landon Zerkel had 94 yards on seven catches, while Johnson and Toderick Hunt each rushed for 12 and 14 carries, respectively.

Defensively, Dusty Bratzler led the Lions with eight tackles and a pass breakup. Jairius Jarvis had a sack to bring his season total to 9.5, just a half sack from tying the single-season record at Southern. Teer also had a sack, while Antwoine Brown, Wesley, and Butler picked up fumble recoveries.

THE DISH ON THE TIGERS: The Tigers have performed a one-year turnaround that saw the team win two games last season to five wins already this season. Fort Hays started the season with wins at Western State and at home against Colorado Mines. They have won against Truman and Emporia State in the league and picked up an exciting 31-20 win at home against Nebraska-Omaha that saw the Tigers score 28 un answered points in the second half.

Quarterback Mike Harrison is the cog in the Tigers' offense. He has thrown for 2,409 yards and 17 touchdowns, and ran for 306 yards and four touchdowns. James Walker is the Tigers' leading rusher with 793 yards and eight touchdowns. OJ Murdock has caught 33 passes for 689 yards and eight scores, while Cordarol Scales has two touchdowns and nearly 13 yards per catch.

Defensively, the Tigers are led by 78 tackles from Nick Dreitz. Seth Blackwell has 74 of his own with five tackles for a loss, while Jacob Crossman leads the team with 9.5 tackles for a loss and 4.5 sacks.

Hays leads the conference and Division II in punt returns, averaging more than 32 yards per return.

LION TIDBITS

A VICTORY VS. HAYS WOULD: be the eighth in the last nine meetings of the schools for the Lions. The last three meetings have resulted in shutouts as the Tigers won 10-0 three years ago and the Lions winning the last two by the scores of 6-0 and 28-0.

NEW POSITION: Johnny Johnson is enjoying his new role as a slot back, splitting time at wideout and running back this season. He has been sharing the backfield with fellow senior Toderick Hunt and while Hunt leads the Lions with 532 yards on the ground, Johnson has rushed for 478 and leads the Lions with four rushing TD's.

REMEMBERING THE FALLEN: Every Southern football player will be wearing a No. 43 decal on their helmets in rememberance of running back Renard Johnson. The junior to be was killed in an auto accident last January on his way back to visit his family in Tulsa.

DOUBLE TROUBLE DT: Senior wide receiver Daniel Thompson caught a pass for a touchdown and also ran for a score in the Lions' opening game against the Harding Bisons. He duplicated the feat to a 'T' at Washburn and picked up another two scores against Emporia in week three, marking four games in a row with two touchdowns. Thompson had a score against Omaha and Pitt, before going without a trip to the endzone against Northwest, bringing his streak of consecutive games with a score to an end at seven. He found the end zone three times against Missouri Western and has had a touchdown in nine of the last 11 games.

DEFENSIVE INJURIES: Senior's Jared Brawner (leg) and Skyler Vandiver (neck), as well as sophomore Brandon Williams (back) and junior Corderial Collier (leg) have all been lost for the season with injuries. Linebacker Richard Williams, Brawner's replacement in the middle, is a game time decision this week against Fort Hays.

INJURIES CONT'D: Sophomore quarterback Collin Howard suffered a knee injury in the homecoming game against Nebaraska-Omaha. He has been out the last four weeks and his prognosis is questionable for a return this season.

CONFERENCE RANKINGS: The Lions, as a team, lead the league in tackles for a loss with 7.11 per game. They rank third in sacks at 2.00 per game, while ranking seventh in rushing offense (153.1), rushing defense (147.8) and sacks allowed (2.0).

INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS: Daniel Thompson is seventh in the MIAA in scoring overall (8.0 ppg) and fifth in scoring "touchdowns" (8.0 ppg). Toderick Hunt is ninth in rushing, while Johnny Johnson is 10th. Thompson and Landon Zerkel rank ninth and tenth in receiving yards per game.

DEFENSE REIGNS SUPREME: The Lions have four players in the top 21 in the MIAA in tackles. Dusty Bratzler ranks fourth (9.1), while Antwoine Brown is 7th (7.9). Justin Cowper (7.0) and David Benham (6.2) rank 15th and 21st, respectively. Jairius Jarvis leads the MIAA in tackles for a loss (1.50), while Dusty Bratzler (0.89) is seventh.

THE BALL STOPS HERE: Jairius Jarvis had one sack in the game last week against Central Missouri and has 9.5 on the season and ranks first in the MIAA and fifth in Division II. The 9.5 sacks rank him second all-time in a single season at MSSU behind Kent Shorten's 1995 total of 10.

PICK'A'LICIOUS: Terrance Scott ranks ninth in the MIAA in interceptions, while Scott and Justin Cowper are fourth in the league in passes defended (break ups + interceptions).

CHART TOPPERS: Senior wide receiver Isaac Norman now ranks seventh in receiving yardage, fourth in receiving touchdowns and is tied for third in pass receptions in a career. Daniel thompson is tied for 10th in single-season scoring, as well.

THE DT TOUCHDOWN EXPRESS: Daniel Thompson caught three touchdown passes in the Lions win at 12th ranked Missouri Western. He was named the MIAA's Player of the Week for the effort. Thompson now has 10 touchdown catches on the season. He is just the second Lion ever to catch double-digit touchdown passes in the same year, joining Hall of Famer Rod Smith in that category. Smith caught 15 in 1991 and 14 in 1993.

SENIOR DAY: Today is senior day for ten Lions seniors. Terrance Scott, Kenton Stephens, Chris Norris, Isaac Norman, Toderick Hunt, David Benham, Rudy Mascaro, Jairius Jarvis, Johnny Johnson and Daniel Thompson will be playing their last game as a Lion.

Lions 28 - @ Fort Hays O

Hays, Kan. - The Missouri Southern defense pitched its second straight shutout of Fort Hays State in as many years, as the Lions defeated the Tigers 28-0 today in front of just over 1,900 fans at Lewis Field Stadium.

Southern (4-3, 2-3 MIAA) won its second road MIAA game of the year for the first time since the 2004 season when the Lions defeated Missouri-Rolla, Truman and Southwest Baptist all on the road. It is the third straight shutout in the series with Fort Hays (2-5, 1-4 MIAA)as the Tigers blanked Southern 10-0 two years ago and the Lions have won the last two (6-0 and 28-0).

The Lions' defense helped put Southern on the board first when Justin Cowper intercepted an Anthony Smith pass and returned it to the Hays' 33 yard line. Adam Hinspeter hooked up with Mark Henderson on the first play from scrimmage and found the receiver at the three yard line. Henderson stayed on his feet and fought his way to the goal line for a 33 yard touchdown.

Southern forced Hays' second turnover of the day when long snapper Brian Borgard popped the Tigers' CJ Lovett on a punt return and forced the fumble, while tight end Chris Bingham came up with the recovery, giving the Lions the ball on the Fort Hays 31 yard line. The Lions couldn't take advantage of the good field position, but an Adam Hinspeter punt put the Tigers at their own four yard line.

The Lions defense forced their third turnover of the half when Jared Brawner recovered a fumble at the Tigers' 15 yard line. Southern took advantage and Colin Howard ran a fake reverse, handed off to Daniel Thompson and Thompson ran 15 yards for the touchdown, putting Southern up 14-0, heading into the locker room.

The Lions picked up their third touchdown of the game when Collin Howard ran for his fourth rushing TD of the season, a 30 yard scamper in the third quarter. Hinspeter and Henderson hooked up again early in the fourth quarter on a 15-yard score to give the Lions a 28-0 lead. Howard stayed in for the next Lions' drive and led the Lions from their own 15 yard line to the Tigers' two, before the Lions tok a knee with 21 seconds to go, giving Hays the ball back at the three. The Tigers ran one play as the clock ran out.

Southern (0-1) had two scores from senior Daniel Thompson, one through the air and another on the ground, and out gained the Bisons, 377-363, but it was in the air where Harding (1-0) made its presence felt.

After a fumble from Collin Howard, Harding took the ball to the four yard line and settled for a 21 yard field goal from Adin Menkin.

The Lions answered back on the very next drive as Thompson ran the perfect reverse and scampered for the 14-yard score. Southern added a safety when David Benham sacked Powell to make the score 9-3, Lions going into the half.

Harding picked up its first touchdown of the day with 13 seconds left in the third when Powell connected with Kurt Adams for a 33 yard touchdown. The Bisons missed the extra point, but Southern was flagged for offsides and gave the Bisons another chance. After a false start pushed Harding back five yards, the Bisons converted on the two point conversion to ao up 11-9.

Howard hooked up with Thompson to give the Lions back the lead on their very next possession, but the two point conversion failed, making the score 15-9.

Harding took the ball with 2:20 left in the game and drove 56 yards before Powell hit Quinn with the game-winner.

Thompson had both the Lions' scores, while Toderick Hunt had 20 carries for 88 yards. Howard had 64 yards on 18 carries. The Lions out-gained Harding 216-65 on the ground, but were out gained 298-161 in the air.

Benham led the Lions with 13 tackles, one forced fumble and a sack. Jarius Jarvis had a sack and a half, while Nick Teer and Domenique Buttler had a sack each. Jared Brawner had a half a sack and 12 total tackles as the Lions racked up five sacks in the game.

Game 2 - @ Washburn 54, Lions 31 • Sept. 12, 2009

Topeka, Kan. - Washburn University scored 38 unanswered points after a Missouri Southern opening drive field goal, en route to a 54-31 win over the Lions tonight at Yager Stadium in Topeka.

The Lions (0-2, 0-1 MIAA) scored first in the game as sophomore kicker Andrew Gassen connected on a 40 yard field goal to cap a 14, play 53 yard drive that lasted 5:13 to start the game

Washburn (3-0, 1-0 MIAA), however, answered on their next drive and drove 72 yards in 6:25 with a 1 yard run from Justin Cooper to go ahead 7-3. The Ichabods then scored touchdowns on their first three drives of the second guarter to go up 28-3. Southern was driving late in the second guarter, but a pass from Collin Howard was intercepted by Zach Watkins at the Washburn 12 yard line. Watkins then ran the ball back to the 50 yard line before Toderick Hunt forced a fumble by Watkins and the Lions' Isaac Norman recovered at the Southern 34. The Lions, however, then fumbled two plays later and Washburn capitalized with a one yard rush from quarterback Dane Simoneau to make the score 35-3 at the half.

Washburn opened up the second half with a 33 yard field goal from Steve Ivanisevic, before the Lions' Johnny Johnson scored on a two-yard run to make the score 38-9. Ivanisevic added two more field goals before Howard and Landon Zerkel hooked up for a 40-yard scoring pass. Ivanisevic added his fourth field goal of the game, this time a 24-yarder, to tie a Washburn record for field goals in a game.

Daniel Thompson added two late scores to make the final tally, 54-31.

Freshman David Snell led the Lions in rushing with 55 yards on nine carries for an average of 6.1 per touch. Howard was 18-29 with two touchdowns, one to Zerkel and another to Thompson.

Game 3 – @ Lions 34, Emporia State 13 • September 19, 2009

Joplin, Mo. - The Missouri Southern defense nearly tied a school record for interceptions in a game, but did force Emporia State to their own record for picks thrown in a game as the Lions defense picked off six passes en route to a 34-13 home opening win in front of more than 4,200 fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium tonight in Joplin.

Southern (1-2, 1-1 MIAA) forced seven turnovers tonight (six interceptions and one fumble recovery) and two touchdowns came directly after a Lions forced turnover. Collin Howard was 14-26 with 204 yards and four touchdowns. Freshman receiver Landon Zerkel caught six passes for 135 yards and an impressive 22 yards per catch. He had two scores. Daniel Thompson caught two touchdown passes, as both of his receptions resulted in scores. It marks the fourth-straight game that Thompson has had two touchdowns or more.

Toderick Hunt rushed 18 times for 108 yards and a score, while Johnny Johnson had 41 yards on 13 carries

Neither team scored on their first three possessions, before Howard and Zerkel hooked up on a 40-yard pass to put the Lions up 7-0 with 1:43 left in the first. A Terrance Scott interception, his first of two in the game, led to the Lions' second score when Hunt ran for a four-yard touchdown, capping off an eight-play, 55 yard drive that ate up 3:39 and put the Lions up 14-0, just shortly into the second quarter.

After a 46-yard touchdown run from the Hornets' Kevin Smith made the score 14-6, another interception, this time one of Justin Cowper's two in the game, led to another Howard to Zerkel catch. The 22 yards pass and catch gave the Lions a 20-6 lead at the 10:42 minute mark of the third guarter. The Lions picked up their fourth touchdown of the game just as the fourth quarter started. Howard scrambled to all sides of the field avoiding multiple tackles before he found a wide-open Thompson just short of the end zone for a score.

Southern had 170 yards on the ground and 204 yards in the air. The Lions outgained Emporia 374-315, but the huge difference were the turnovers the Southern defense forced on the night.

Teer led the Lions with 10 tackles and a sack on the night. Cowper and Scott both had two interceptions, with Cowper running his back for 31 yards. Both added pass breakups as well. Josh Woodard had seven tackles, a sack and an interception, while Richard Williams picked up an interception of his own.

The Lions had six tackles for a loss of 31 yards on the night, with one forced fumble and recovery, six interceptions, seven pass breakups, three sacks and three quarterback hurries.

Game 4 – UNO 44, @ Lions 36 • September 26, 2008

Joplin, Mo.. - The Missouri Southern football team had its highest point output of the season and Collin Howard threw for three touchdowns, but the Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks had a school record 44 rushing attempts from true freshman Levi Terrell in his first collegiate game and the Mavs defeated the Lions 44-36 in front of a Homecoming crowd of 6,127 fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (1-3, 1-2 MIAA) was led offensively from Johnny Johnson as the senior had 117 yards on seven carries and a touchdown Johnson also picked up a receiving touchdown, as well. Howard went 12-31 for three touchdowns and Landon Zerkel caught three passes for 65 yards and a score. Daniel Thompson had two catches for 47 yards and a score, while Toderick Hunt had 55 yards on 11 carries.

UNO (3-2, 2-1 MIAA) scored on its first play from scrimmage with a 41 yard pass from Greg Wunderlich to Brian Miller. The Mays scored again midway through the first quarter as Wunderlich hooked up with Brett Bohuslavsky for a five yard score.

The Lions wouldn't wait very long for their first score as Johnson scored his first touchdown on the very next drive, a five yard pass from Howard. That play capped off a six play, 73 yard drive that took 1:23 off the clock. The Lions would then capitalize on poor special teams from the Mavs as a pooch kick from Andrew Gassen went un-touched and the Lions recovered on the UNO 33 yard line. Johnson then took over and ran 42 yards on the second play of the drive to tie the game at 14.

The Lions added a touchdown from Howard to Zerkel to go ahead momentarily 21-20, but another Zuerlein field goal, this time 23 yards, gave the Mavs a 23-21 halftime lead.

The two teams traded scores in the third quarter as the Lions got a 30 yard touchdown catch from Daniel Thompson, but two scores in the fourth from UNO put the game out of reach. A late fumble recovery and touchdown scamper from the Lions' Antoine Brown made the final score 44-36.

Southern was out-gained 570-370. It was the first time the Lions had given up 500 yards since Southern gave up 592 in last season's finale against Northwest Missouri. The Lions came into the game averaging over 33 minutes a game in time of possession, but Southern could only hold the ball for just under 19 minutes.

Game 5 – Pittsburg State 21 @ Lions 13 • October 3, 2009

Joplin, Mo.. - Three costly interceptions led to all three Pittsburg State touchdowns as the Missouri Southern Football team fell to the Gorillas, 21-13 today in front of 7,738 fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium in the Sonic Miners Bowl.

Southern (1-4, 1-3 MIAA) has now lost 16 games in a row to the Gorillas (3-3, 1-3 MIAA) with the Lions' last win coming in 1993 when Rod Smith and Southern captured the MIAA title.

Pitt just barely out-gained the Lions (372-365) as Southern rushed for 185 yards and passed for 180 in quarterback Roland Thompson's first collegiate start. Only one of Pitt's three scoring drives started in their own territory as favorable field position helped PSU throughout the game.

Johnny Johnson rushed for 72 yards, while Toderick Hunt had 63 and a score. Daniel Thompson had 73 yards receiving with a score, and 19 yards on two rushes on the ground. Roland Thompson went 16-34 for 180 yards and a score, and rushed for 41 yards, as well.

Dusty Bratzler led the Lions' defense with 14 tackles and 1.5 for a loss. Nick Teer had nine stops, while Justin Cowper and Richard Williams had eight each. The Lions had six pass breakups and one quarterback hurry.

Neither team scored in the first quarter, as both teams gained seven first downs and split the time of possession nearly down the middle. The Gorillas got on top first with a three yard run from Eric Love. The Lions answered right back and with good field position, capped off a 12 play, 55-yard drive that resulted in a Hunt touchdown run to tie the game at the half.

Pitt went ahead 14-7 after a three-yard run from Cardell Clemons and took a 21-7 lead late in the fourth guarter as guarterback Jeff Smith connected with Kendall Fisher for an 11-yard touchdown catch, the only scoring drive for PSU that started in its own territory.

The Lions cut the lead to 21-13 with 1:44 left in the game when Roland Thompson hit Daniel Thompson for a 13-yard score, but the extra point was missed to make the final tally 21-13.

Game 6 – @ #6 Northwest Missouri 52, Lions 6 • October 10, 2009

Maryville, Mo .. - In a game that was dominated by sixth ranked Northwest Missouri State, the Missouri Southern Lions fell 52-6 to the Bearcats today in a frigid Maryville where game time temperatures hovered around freezing.

Southern (1-5, 1-4 MIAA) gained 207 yards total on the afternoon with 128 coming on the ground. The Lions were led offensively by Johnny Johnson as the senior had 61 yards on the ground and a touchdown score. Toderick Hunt had 43 yards on the ground, while four different Lions had 12 or more yards through the air.

The Lions' defense was led by 13 tackles (nine solo) from Antwoine Brown. Justin Cowper and Dusty Bratzler had nine each, while Jairius Jarvis had five tackles and 1.5 sacks. Bratzler added a sack of his own, while Nick Teer got in on a sack with Jarvis.

Northwest (6-1, 5-1 MIAA) took the opening snap and drove the length of the field, but the Lions' defense stopped the high-powered Bearcat offense inside the ten and Northwest settled for a 24-yard field goal from Todd Adolf.

After a Lions turnover on downs, Northwest again drove the field and scored, this time a 27-yard pass from Blake Bolles to Jake Soy. A Lions interception led to another score from Bolles to Soy as the duo hooked up on three scores in the first half before Blake Christopher and Soy added another one as the half expired. Northwest scored on six of its seven drives in the first half to take a 38-0 lead into the break.

After the first two drives of the second half stalled for Northwest, the Bearcats picked up a score as Christopher hit Kyle Killgore for a 31-yard pass to make the score 45-0 Northwest

The Lions then got the ball at their own 34 and drove the length of the field as Johnson capped off an eight-play, 66-yard scoring drive that lasted 2:07 with a threeyard touchdown run, Southern's only score of the day.

Game 7 - @ Lions 20, Truman 16 • October 17, 2009

Joplin, Mo.. - A 30-yard touchdown pass from Roland Thompson to Landon Zerkel with 11:31 left in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winner as the Missouri Southern football team defeated visiting Truman State, 20-16 today at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (2-5, 2-4 MIAA) was out gained 350-302 and was a minus four in the turnover battle, but the Lions defense came up strong when they needed to holding Truman scoreless for the final 13 and a half minutes of the game.

Thompson completed 13-23 for 182 yards and two touchdowns, but was 8-10 in the second half. Toderick Hunt had 64 yards on the ground, while Thompson had 41 of his own. Daniel Thompson caught three passes for 69 yards and a score and Zerkel had two catches for 38 vards and the game-winning catch.

Andrew Gassen, in his first game back after suffering a concussion in the homecoming game against Nebraska-Omaha, was 2-2 in field goals with distances of 30 and and a career-high 47 yards. He also had three punts for an average of 46.3 yards, including a long 74 yard boot, and averaged 64.2 yards on kickoffs.

After both teams went scoreless in the first guarter, Truman (1-7, 0-6 MIAA) opened up the scoring with a three-yard run from Vaness Emokpae with seven minutes left in the first half. Gassen's first field goal of the day made it 7-3, before a 30-yarder from Truman kicker Mickey Masucci gave the Bulldogs a 10-3 lead at the half.

The Lions tied the game at ten after a 33-yard pass from Roland Thompson to Daniel Thompson with 6:52 left in the third, before another field goal from Masucci, this time a 23-yarder gave the Bulldogs a 13-10 advantage. Gassen's 47-yarder made it 13 all before a 26-varder from Masucci, again gave the Bulldogs a three-point advantage.

The Lions put away Truman, however, with 11:31 left in the ball game, when Thompson hooked up with Zerkel as the redshirt freshman caught the ball inside the five and lunged to the end zone for the score.

Justin Cowper and Dusty Bratzler each had 12 tackles today with Cowper having two stops behind the line and three pass breakups. David Benham had nine tackles, while Rudy Mascaro and Andwoine Brown had eight each. Jairius Jarvis had five tackles, and a pass breakup, but three of the stops were sacks for a loss of 18 yards. The Lions had eight tackles behind the line of scrimmage today, and seven pass break ups with three quarterback hurries.

Game 8 – Lions 35 @ #12 Missouri Western 34 • October 24, 2009

Joplin, Mo.. - The Missouri Southern football team scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter, capped off by a 10-yard touchdown pass from Roland Thompson to Daniel Thompson with 12 seconds left and defeated 12th ranked Missouri Western, 35-34 in St. Joseph today.

The Lions (3-5, 3-4 MIAA) get their first win in St. Joseph since 1997 and their first win over a ranked opponent since 2001 when the Lions defeated 11th ranked Central Missouri 35-13 at home. Daniel Thompson caught a career-high 160 yards in the air and came down with a career-high three touchdowns in the win. Roland Thompson went 22-41 and 248 vards with four touchdown passes, all career-highs for the junior, Johnny Johnson had 72 yards on seven carries and Toderick Hunt had 68 yards on 18 carries

Western (7-2, 5-2 MIAA) took just three plays to take an early lead as Drew Newhart evaded the Lion's defensive pressure in the back field and found a wide open Ferrell McGhee for a 91-yard touchdown pass.

Warrensburg, Mo. - Nineteenth ranked Central Missouri scored 20 points in the fourth quarter and rebounded from an early 10-0 deficit to defeat the Lions 27-17 today in Warrensburg

Last week, it was the Lions (3-6, 3-5 MIAA) scoring points in the fourth quarter to overcome a deficit, but the tables were turned today as the Mules (8-2, 6-2 MIAA) scored 20 points in the fourth to defeat the Lions and keep their playoff hopes alive.

Southern scored first as the Lions took advantage of a fumble from the Mules' DeMarco Cosby that was recovered by Jabarri Wesley and returned 11 yards to the Central Missouri 45-yard line. Roland Thompson completed two passes for for 16 yards and ran for another 13, before Andrew Gassen booted a 29-yard field goal to put Southern up on top, 3-0.

The Lions took a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter after Johnny Johnson capped off a 12-play drive that took up 61 yards and 3:38 off the clock when Johnson found the end zone on a four-yard run. Thompson completed passes of 24, 10 and 14 on the drive.

The Mules answered back quickly and after the Lions had a three and out, Central took just two plays to score when Czerniewski found Bobby Guillory for a 47-yard catch to cut the Lions' lead to 10-7 heading into halftime.

Neither team scored in the third, but Central scored just two minutes into the fourth on a one-yard run from Czerniewski. Guillory made the score 20-10 when he scampered to the end zone on a 33-yard touchdown. Each team added a late score for the final tally.

The Lions were out-gained 480-337 today, but were close in most every other category with the Mules. Central held a 20-19 advantage on first downs, and time of possession was nearly identical. Both teams had three turnovers with the Lions throwing three interceptions, but picking up three of the five Central Missouri fumbles. The big stat where Central had an advantage was on punt and kickoff returns. The Mules averaged 21.3 yards per punt return as opposed to the Lions 5.5 and 11.7 yards on kickoffs to the Lions' 4.4.

Thompson was the Lions leading rusher with 44 yards and a touchdown score. He averaged 6.3 yards per carry. He also went 21-47 for 239 yards. Landon Zerkel had 94 yards on seven catches, while Johnson and Toderick Hunt each rushed for 12 and 14 carries, respectively.
